Sister Anne Scholarship Program

The Program

St. Mary's Foundation has established a scholarship program in memory of Sister Anne Goulet, to encourage undergraduate academic pursuits for a clinical career in health care.

Funded by St. Mary's Foundation, scholarships are given without regard to race, color, creed, religion, gender, sexual orientation, disability or national origin.

Eligibility

Applicants must have a high school diploma or equivalent at time of application. A person may receive only one Sister Anne Scholarship in his/her lifetime.

Scholarship Awards

Scholarships are \$500 each per year to be used for tuition, books, supplies and fees. Four awards may be granted per year for academic pursuits in clinical healthcare careers. Additional awards may be granted at the discretion of the Administrative Team subject to the financial status of the endowment. The scholarship(s) may be awarded after consideration of all presented information.

Application

Applications are available from St. Mary's Foundation, 1027 Washington Ave, Detroit Lakes, MN 56501. These materials can be copied for distribution.

Applicants are solely responsible for gathering and submitting all necessary information. All information submitted is confidential and will be reviewed only by the selection committee.

Completed application material with required documents must be received by the Development Office no later than June 15th with scholarships being awarded on or before August 15th.

Recipient Selection

A Sister Anne Scholarship Committee selects recipients on the basis of academic achievement, leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, work experience, statement of education and career goals and a letter(s) of recommendation by a direct supervisor or faculty member.

The number of scholarships awarded will be based on St. Mary's selection procedures and available funds. Not all applicants will receive awards.

Obligations

Scholarship recipients must enroll in the educational programs no later than the fall of the year in which the award is given. Recipients are required to provide St. Mary's with current transcripts and to notify St. Mary's of any changes in address, school enrollment or other pertinent information.

Payment of Awards

St. Mary's Administrative Team authorizes scholarship payments. Payments are made in one installment. Checks are mailed to each recipient's home address and are payable jointly to the student and the school and must be endorsed by both.

Revision Policy

The general conditions and procedures under which scholarships are made are subject to periodic review by St. Mary's, including termination of the program.



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Sister Anne Goulet

Rose Anne Goulet was born in Crookston, the first of five children in the family of John and Alphonsine (St. Martin) Goulet. In September, 1923, when the still incomplete Mount Saint Benedict Academy opened its doors, Rose was among the boarding students. Compelled by a desire to dedicate her life to the service of God, Rose joined the Benedictine community at Mount Saint Benedict in December, 1924, and made her permanent monastic profession in 1929.

Sister Anne became a registered nurse in 1931. She went on to take a training course in x-ray technology in Chicago, and in 1941, she became a medical laboratory technician and a registered x-ray technologist.

Sister Anne was put in charge of the x-ray and laboratory departments at Saint Anthony Hospital in Mahanomen, MN, in 1949, at the same time serving as administrator of the twenty-five bed hospital. At Saint Mary's Hospital in Detroit Lakes, she supervised laboratory, x-ray and emergency services and initiated Saint Mary's School of X-ray Technology and the Becker County Blood Bank, later known as C.W. Moberg Memorial Blood Bank.

In 1955, Sister Anne collaborated with Eileen Mahoney Oxley to organize Saint Mary's Hospital Auxiliary, an enterprise which became the most rewarding experience of Sister Anne's twenty-eight years at Saint Mary's. Under her guidance, auxiliary volunteers known as Pink Ladies, Blue Men and Candy Strippers went into action in every department of the hospital. From 1963 to 1971, as Assistant Administrator and Personnel Director, Sister Anne organized the Pastoral Care Department which she directed until her retirement in 1978. She was active in The *Detroit Lakes Business and Professional Women's Club* (BPWC), a group which named her *Woman of the Year* in 1976.

After her retirement from hospital work, Sister Anne did home nursing in Fargo, East Grand Forks and Bemidji. She returned to Mount Saint Benedict Monastery in May, 1998. She became a resident in the monastery Health Center in April, 2001. When she was transferred to Villa Saint Vincent due to ill health in 2004, realizing how well she was being cared for, she declared, "I can find no greater happiness on earth. My next destination is heaven!"

Sister Anne was preceded in death by her parents, an infant sister Evelyn, a brother Leonard and a sister Caroline Brunelle. She is survived by the members of her monastic community, which includes Sister Florentine, her sister, two nephews and several nieces, cousins and other relatives.
